Now, people take opportunity of the day to wish 'Happy Valentine's Day' to anyone they love, be it father, mother, teachers, siblings, friends, co-workers or just anyone special to them. The idea behind this tradition is to celebrate love, get love and give love to everyone around us.

During the Middle Ages, it was commonly believed in France and England that February 14 was the beginning of birds' mating season, which added to the idea that Valentine's Day should be a day for romance. Approximately 150 million Valentine's Day cards are exchanged annually, making Valentine's Day the second most popular card-sending holiday after Christmas.

RECIPE CORNER

This month is all about romance and love, so here are some favorite to prepare on Valentine's Day. There's still time for you to impress your loved ones this month!

Red Velvet Cheesecake

- 2 packages (8 ounces each) cream cheese, softened
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 eggs

- 2 ounces semi-sweet baking chocolate, melted
- 1 tablespoon red food color
- 1 prepared chocolate crumb crust, (6 ounces)

PREPARATION

- Preheat oven to 350°F. Beat cream cheese, sugar and vanilla in large bowl with electric mixer on medium speed until well blended. Add eggs, 1 at a time, beating on low speed after each addition just until blended.
- Measure 1 cup batter into medium bowl.
 Stir in melted chocolate and food color. Pour into crust. Top with remaining (plain) cheesecake batter.
- Bake 40 minutes or until center is almost set. Cool completely on wire rack.
- Refrigerate 3 hours or overnight.

Surprise Raspberry Heart Cupcakes

INGREDIENTS

12 (1 cupcake) Servings


- 1 package (2-layer size) white cake mix
- 1 tablespoon plus 2 teaspoons Raspberry extract, divided
- 24 drops red food color
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1/2 cup (1 stick) butter, softened
- 4 cups confectioners' sugar
- 5 tablespoons heavy cream

PREPARATION

- Preheat oven to 350°F. Prepare cake mix as directed on package. Remove 1 1/2 cups of the batter to medium bowl. Stir in 1 tablespoon of the raspberry flavor and red food color. Pour into greased 8-inch square baking pan. Reserve remaining batter.
- Bake 12 minutes or until toothpick inserted into center comes out clean. Cool on wire rack. Cut out 12 heart shapes with 1-inch heart-shaped cookie cutter. Set aside.
- Stir vanilla into reserved batter. Pour 1/2 off the batter evenly into 12 paper-lined muffin cups. Press 1 cake heart vertically into center of each muffin cup. Pour remaining batter over top.

Bake 15 to 18 minutes or until top of cupcake is set. Cool cupcakes on wire rack.

 Meanwhile, beat butter and remaining 2 teaspoons raspberry flavor in large bowl until light and fluffy. Gradually add confectioners' sugar alternately with cream, beating well after each addition and scraping sides and bottom of bowl frequently. Frost cooled cupcakes with frosting.

Be Mine Marshmallow Bars

INGREDIENTS

24 Servings

- 1/4 cup (1/2 stick) butter
- 1 package (10 ounces) marshmallows
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 10 to 12 drops red food color
- 6 cups crispy rice cereal
- Valentine's Day conversation hearts, for garnish

PREPARATION

- Line 13x9-inch baking pan with foil. Lightly butter or spray foil with no stick cooking spray.
- Melt butter in large saucepan or Dutch oven on low heat. Add marshmallows; stir constantly until marshmallows are melted.
 Remove from heat.
- Stir in vanilla and food color until smooth. Quickly add cereal to marshmallow mixture and stir until well coated.
 Press into prepared pan using a buttered spatula. Sprinkle with Valentine's Day conversation hearts. Cool. Cut into bars or use heart-shaped cookie cutters.

LSNORR Guest Speaker Recap Jim Letten Gives Lesson on Foreign Corrupt Practices Act

Jim Letten spoke at LSNORR's membership meeting on January 30, 2018. His topic: US laws governing US persons and companies doing business internationally–in order to prevent bribery. This is a recap of what we learned.

Who is Jim Letten?

To many local residents, Jim Letten needs no introduction. He is a familiar name and face, having served as a US Attorney in New Orleans for over a decade. He has practiced law for 39 years and currently works for the law firm of Butler Snow in New Orleans.

What Is FCPA?

Letten described the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act (FCPA) as a US law enacted in 1977 that carries criminal penalties. FCPA regulates the act of giving anything of value to any foreign official for any kind of business advantage. Examples include expediting permits or extending contracts with anyone from custom officials to heads of state.

Who Needs To Know?

Broadly, FCPA applies to any person or entity connected to anyone in a foreign country. Letten explained that this can include an actual company (whether public or private, no matter the size), its employees, or even contractors that deal with the company.

Why Was It Enacted?

The US saw that there was corruption, Letten said, and also recognized that corruption affects trades like human trafficking and counterfeiting—and even larger threats, like terrorism.

Although Letten said that the US was a "lone wolf" when it first created FCPA, over time countries worldwide began developing similar laws.

Accounting Provision

FCPA contains an accounting provision, which Letten said technically only applies to companies that issue stock, although private companies could also benefit from following it. According to the provision, the company must maintain records of ALL payments made, and the records must conform to general accounting principles.

Why should private companies care if they don't really have to comply? As

an example, Letten said that maybe a disgruntled employee blows the whistle to authorities. What happens? You get visited by federal and state investigators. Now, if you have documented every transaction—every transaction—Letten indicated the government will see you have a "culture of compliance."

And, if you've kept detailed records, you will have recorded small bribes. Wait, what? Hold that thought.

Bribes

Letten said the US knows that if you do business outside of the country, it's when, not if one of your field employees pays a bribe. "Everyone messes up," Letten said. There's a catch phrase for bribery and the culture of gift-giving: "you scratch my back and I'll scratch yours."

He said that huge, well-known companies have been prosecuted for doing things like spending millions on cash bribes. Think of a multi-million dollar loan that you don't expect to be repaid.

Interestingly, Letten added, some use more subtle methods, like hosting a seminar. Harmless? On the surface, perhaps; but then consider that it's in a resort venue, lasts several weeks, and the attendees get treated to cars, cash, and other entertaining incentives.

Small Bribe Provision

Let's mentally go back to where we talked about recording small bribes. Letten explained that the official terms are "facilitating payments" or "greasing payments."

Interestingly, Letten explained that FCPA includes an exception for a small bribe. He detailed the requirements: the payment must be small, cover a minor, non-discretionary thing, and be logged as a facilitating payment. He said that the US government looks for accurate and honest records, and if these are provided, they know you are doing your best to abide by the law.

And when do these small bribes come up? More often than you might think. He offered an example.

One of your field employees is overseas driving a truck down a road, and it's filled with produce. Your truck gets stopped by men who are collecting fees, and they won't allow anyone to continue on without paying. So, your driver pays.

Self-Reporting

Letten said the US created a selfreporting program for times when a company finds a huge internal violation, such as an executive creating a dummy corporation that funnels millions into bribes.

When this discovery comes to light, you have an "uh oh" moment and consider your options. He said you could take a risk and keep it quiet. But if the government finds out, then everyone who helped to hide it will probably get arrested. On top of that, the company will pay a huge fine and might even go out of business.

Letten said the other (better) option is to quickly self-report the violation, disclose any remedial actions taken, and open your books to show your culture of compliance.

Based on Letten's experience, if these steps are followed there is a presumption that no criminal action will be pursued against the company. The government knows that companies will sometimes find employees who violate the FCPA.

Importance of Compliance

Since going into private practice, Letten found that the importance of FCPA compliance pops up in mergers and acquisitions. (Side note: he really enjoys M&As.) Consider that maybe a company wants to buy your subsidiary. The buyer wants a certification that your company is compliant with FCPA. Why is this a good idea?

Letten said that a big reason is that more companies are purchased with delayed payouts. Let's say as part of the purchase, the buyer offers \$25M now and \$10M in two years. Then you find out the buyer has a deferred prosecution agreement. So if they have to spend money on attorney's fees and settlements, will you get your second payment?
